Zookeepers, Animal Handlers and Camp Zoo Staff provide instructions to ensure safety. Practice following basic directions at home to help your camper prepare! Practice responding when their name is called!

#### ✓ I can ask for help!

Communication is key to a successful week of camp! Help empower your camper by practicing how to ask for help!
