

Dear Parents and Attendees,

As you may have already heard, we are planning to go on a mission trip to the area of Juarez, Mexico.

Besides the registration fee charge you will also need money for up to 8 meals while traveling and \$10-15 for a stop on the way home.

Please note: We can use a lot more money for projects – All additional monies collected will stay with the ministries we will be serving even if we don't use it!

We will be staying at the New Beginnings Compound in Juarez. It is fairly safe within the compound areas but all travels and activities beyond the compounds are limited and planned by staff for safety.

During the Trip we will be reading and discussing the book "Eternity In Their Hearts" to help train participants to have a missions mindset. Eternity in Their Hearts gives fascinating, real-life examples of ways people groups have exhibited terms and concepts in their histories that have prepared them for the gospel. Read how Pachacuti, the Inca king who founded Machu Picchu, the majestic fortress in Peru, accomplished something far more significant than merely building fortresses, temples, or monuments. He sought, reached out, and found a God far greater than any popular "god" of his own culture. And there have been others throughout the world, like him, who lived to receive the blessing of the gospel.

Those attending can expect to get very dirty each day as many of the projects involve cleaning, building, etc.

We only have a few showers available for the whole team so 5-10 minute showers are the maximum time to expect for shower needs.

On the first Sunday we are there we sometimes visit the market to purchase a few souvenirs but we also try to purchase most of our souvenirs from the families that are part of Amigos en Cristo. We will be walking a lot and the group will be required to walk very close each way. We do go past a lot of people who are begging. They should not be given handouts as most of the individuals choose this as a lifestyle/job. If anything, we try to give food not money.

The Team leaders that will be going include Dennis Siler and Tim Hadley.

We have enclosed a lot of information, some of which is only tentative as we are open to serving as best needed by the ministry in the area.

Friday

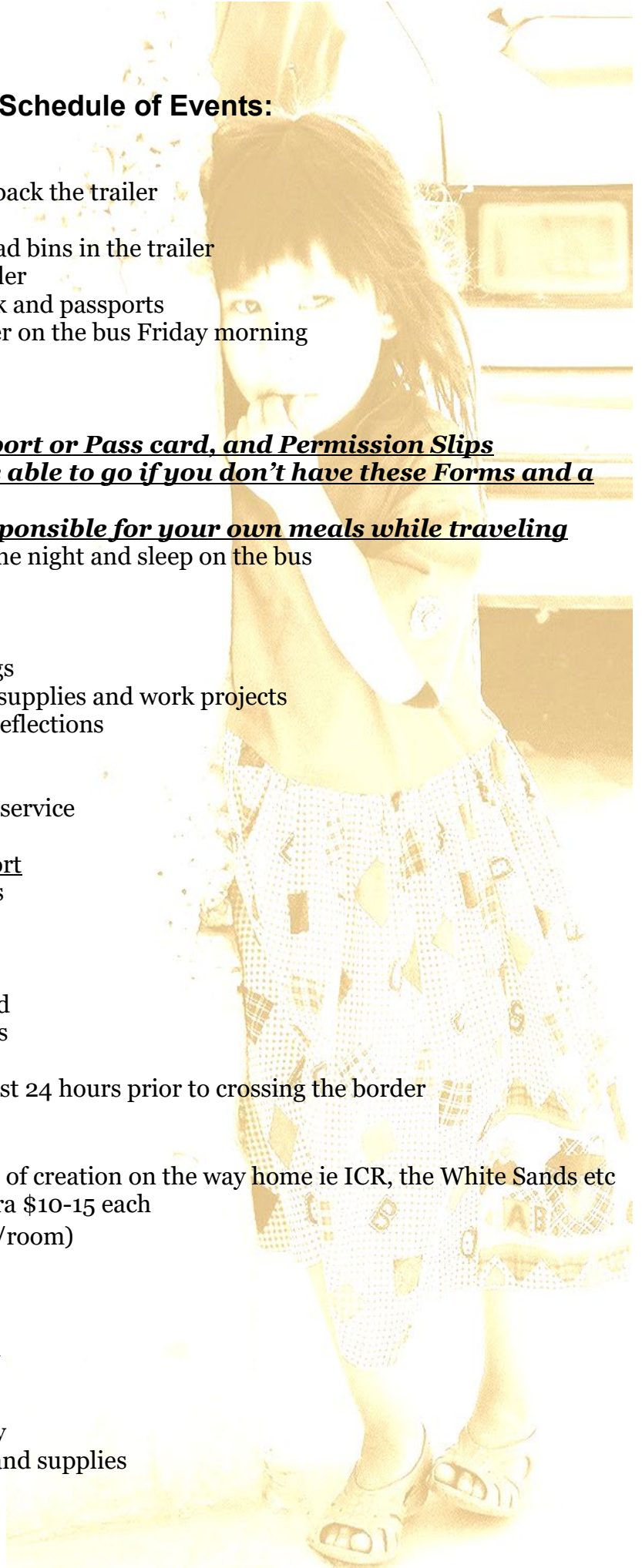
- Start travel back to Wisconsin
 - We may visit a special place of creation on the way home ie ICR, the White Sands etc
 - This may cost an extra \$10-15 each
 - Stay in a Hotel in the US (4/room)

- 7:00 am Continental Breakfast
 - Drive straight through

Sunday:

- 10:00am-8pm - Arrive back to Westby
 - Unpack, organize tools and supplies



Notes on what to bring:

Name labeled on EVERYTHING

Pack in one 18 gallon Rubbermaid tub:

- All your clothes (for 10 days):
 - Bring clothes that can get dirty.
 - Gloves and ear plugs
 - All clothes must be modest – if in doubt don't bring it.
 - No clothes with rips or tears or cutoff sleeves
 - One pair of nice blue jeans, One pair of casual pants
 - Work/painting clothes
 - Your clothing cannot say anything not honoring Christ.
 - **You can leave any clothing that someone there might want**
- Tennis shoes
- Pajamas: need to be totally modest to be seen in public!
- Toiletries
- Jacket in case of cold or rain; temperatures could be in the 80's and get down to the 30's
- Towel and washcloth

One Garbage bag – Pack one for the way home as well!

- Your sleeping bag
- One pillow, or you can bring this on the bus to try and rest

Backpack

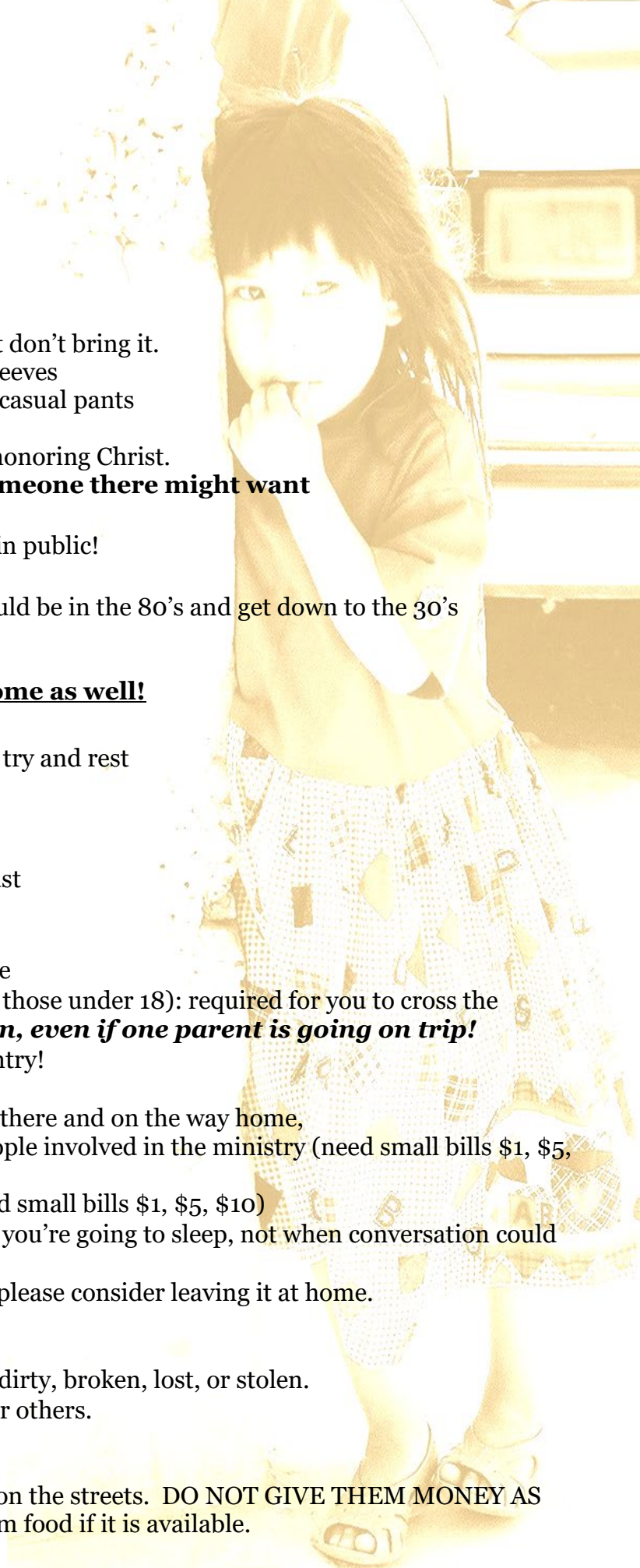
- Your Bible – you will use it!
- Journal book and two pens – this is a daily must
- Water bottle
- Deodorant and toothbrush
- Current passport/Pass card and driver's license
- Mexico permission slip from your parents (for those under 18): required for you to cross the border into Mexico. **Both parents must sign, even if one parent is going on trip!**
- Any other documentation if from another country!
- Money:
 - Money for up to 6 meals on the way there and on the way home,
 - Cash to purchase items from the people involved in the ministry (need small bills \$1, \$5, \$10)
 - Cash for the market on Sunday (need small bills \$1, \$5, \$10)
- Music players with Christian music only when you're going to sleep, not when conversation could be happening).
- Minimize what you bring if it's not on this list please consider leaving it at home.

What NOT to bring:

- Anything valuable that will upset you if it gets dirty, broken, lost, or stolen.
- Anything else that might cause a distraction for others.

BRING A HEART TO SERVE!

Remember: You will encounter people begging on the streets. **DO NOT GIVE THEM MONEY AS THEY DO THIS FOR A LIVING.** We will give them food if it is available.



Mission Trip

SAFETY RULES

Personal

1. Follow directions.
2. Stay with your assigned group.
3. Always be with at least one other person.
4. Pedestrians do not have the right of way.
5. Carry your own water.

Travel

1. No leaving the vehicle without permission.
2. NO switching vehicles.
3. No shopping or bathroom breaks at gas stations unless told. (We will stop at large rest areas to accommodate everyone quickly.)
4. Please use the restrooms at scheduled breaks. We will only pull over to the side of the road for needs between the scheduled breaks.

Health & Sanitation

1. Wash hands frequently; always before eating and after using the bathroom.
2. Don't share hairbrushes, combs, hats or pillows.
3. See designated health provider if you have a health concern. (We will have over-the-counter meds.)
4. Don't drink any water out of a faucet once in Mexico! You will get very sick!

Work Safety

1. Bring a pair of work shoes or boots (helps on uneven terrain)
2. Bring a pair of good work gloves (saves on blister and sharp objects)
3. Bring a couple of pair of ear plugs (helps when around noisy equipment)

Possessions

1. Don't wear expensive clothing, jewelry, watches or cameras.
2. Don't leave valuables sitting around or in vans unattended.
3. Expensive cameras can get very dusty, broken or stolen
4. Lock vehicle doors.
5. Don't leave keys in the vehicles, EVER!
6. Don't make it obvious how much money you are carrying.
7. Don't fight someone who is trying to steal from you.
