Camp Lawroweld FAQ's

Q: Tell me about check-in and check-out at Camp Lawroweld:

A: Check-in time for campers at Camp Lawroweld is on Sundays from 4:00pm-5:00pm. Please do not arrive before 4:00pm, as our staff are preparing for your arrival. Check-out time for campers on Sundays from Camp Lawroweld is from 9:00am-9:30am. It is essential that you check-out on time so the staff can clean and prepare for the next week of camp. **If you are not check-out until after 9:30am on Sunday, your UltraCamp account will be charged \$15 per half hour.** We cannot accommodate supervision for your junior or teen camper if you have children doing both junior and teen camp. **The pickup and drop-off times still apply.**

Q: What should I avoid packing?

A: Camp Lawroweld has a “no technology” policy for Junior and Teen Camp. This includes cell phones, gaming consoles, etc. Please leave those items at home. Be advised that the counselors will keep the technology for the week if it is brought and being used. Lawroweld is a place to connect with other campers and enjoy the beauty of nature. The camper can use the lodge land line to make necessary calls, free of charge. Due to safety and security issues, we request that all jewelry be left at home. Fireworks, matches, lighters, flames of all kinds, drugs, cigarettes, alcohol, knives, utility tools, and weapons of any kind are not allowed. Should you decide to bring any unsafe items, you will be asked to leave and/or the items will be confiscated.

Q: What SHOULD I pack?

A: Sleeping bag, pillow, everyday clothes, nice outfit for Sabbath, underwear, long pants/jeans, sweater/jacket, pajamas, closed toe shoes & socks, flip flops for the shower, **modest swimsuit**, beach towel, shower towel & washcloth, soap, shampoo & conditioner, comb/brush, toothbrush, toothpaste, sunscreen, water bottle, insect repellent, laundry bag, Bible, flashlight, store money, camera. It's helpful if children's items have names written on them.

Q: What activities do you offer?

A: Water Skiing, Wake Boarding, Knee Boarding, Wake Surfing, Tubing, Swimming, Swim Lessons, Water Trampoline, Sailing, Kayaking, Canoeing, Disc Golf, Archery, Mountain Biking, Gymnastics, Rock Wall, Ceramics, Candle Making, Pottery, Model Rocketry, Baking, Drawing, Basketball, Volleyball, Soccer, and Ultimate Frisbee. There will also be large group games at our evening “Big Event” and other specialty classes offered by our staff who have special interests (book club, origami, etc.).

Q: Do you have a doctor or nurse onsite at camp?

A: Camp Lawroweld has an RN on site and available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for all medical needs. Our nurse cares for the distribution of medications at each meal. If you or your child has allergies that require an EpiPen, please alert the nurse during check-in. Please do not bring any family member if they are running a temperature. The fever must have subsided for at least 24 hours before they can come to camp. During check-in, the nurse will check the temperature of all campers and will also check for head-lice. If either is positive, the camper will unfortunately have to go home.

Q: Camper Housing: Do I get to choose?

A: The short answer is no, because things change every year and we need to remain flexible on our end. If your child has a relative or friend they'd like to be in the same cabin with, email Trevor Schlisner that request and we can most likely accommodate. Junior and Teen Campers usually share cabins with other campers of the same age. We do not take accommodation requests for Family Camps but do our best to put families in spaces where true needs are met. Some of the larger cabins that have a private bathroom (boy's side) can be obtained if families are willing to stay in the same space with another family that is well known to them. If that is the case and it is agreed upon by both families, we want to put you in those larger spaces so more families can come to camp!

Q: Camper Mail

A: We suggest using USPS or UPS. Please address mail as follows:

Q: What's camp food like?

A: You will enjoy three healthy meals each day during camp. Meals served are vegetarian, but may include eggs, cheese and milk. If you have special dietary needs, please communicate these and we will do our best to accommodate. Common meals may include pancakes, cereal, Lawroweld's legendary granola, macaroni and cheese, pizza, spaghetti, bean and cheese burritos and the like. There will always be an assortment of fruit and vegetables as well.

Q: I lost something at camp. What do I do?

A: The best policy is to check to make sure you have picked up ALL your belongings before you leave Camp Lawroweld. All unclaimed items of significant value are only kept for two weeks following each week of camp. **CAMP LAWROWELD IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR LOST ITEMS.** Please call the camp at 207-585-2984 to see if your item has been found.

Q: What's your refund policy and when is payment due?

A: Junior, Teen, and Blind Camp: If a cancellation request is made within 14 days prior to your camp, a refund will be given, less a \$50 fee. Full payment or a payment plan option can be selected when you register (payment plan not available for Blind Campers receiving Christian Records Services scholarships). Full payment is due 60 days prior to the start of your camp. This includes the family members of blind campers but does not apply to a blind camper.

Family Camp: Full refunds will be given up to 60 days prior to the start of the week you registered for. Half refunds will be given between 30 and 60 days. No refunds will be issued within 30 days of camp. Full payment or a payment plan option can be selected when you register for camp. Full payment is due 60 days prior to your camp starting.

Q: What does the Lawroweld Camp Store sell and can I leave a credit?

A: Various items are sold at the camp store. You have the opportunity to buy items that help you remember your fun-filled week at camp. You and your family will find a wide variety of items

such as stuffed animals, water bottles, t-shirts, hats, and hoodies. There are also snack items, smoothies, and fresh juices available for purchase. During registration for junior and teen camp, parents can leave cash or credit for the camper to use during the week. Any unused funds will be reimbursed at pick-up. Leaving a credit on UltraCamp (our registration site) is not an option.

Q: What's the weather like?

A: Summer days are warm, and nights are delightfully cool. Trees provide shade for our camp, nestled right on the shore of Lake Webb. The days are usually in the 70s-80's, with nights in the high 50's-60's.

Q: Can we bring our pet?

A: We love animals and know you love your pet. However, our policy is no pets allowed on Camp Lawroweld property. Thank you for understanding.

Q: Does my child have to take a swim test?

A: Yes. Your child's safety is our priority, and each camper will take a swim test on the day of arrival (this includes children attending family camps). Color coordinated bands will be worn by the camper and indicate to the lifeguards on duty the swimming ability of the camper.

Q: Are the fees for attending Camp Lawroweld tax deductible?

Directions from Interstate 95

Take Interstate 95 North, continue until the **pay tolls** just before Exit 75. Pay toll and continue on to Exit 75.


Take the US-202/ME-4/ME-100 exit, EXIT 75, toward Auburn.

LEFT unto US-202/ME-4 (~24.5 miles) Stay on ME-4 North through Auburn/Turner.

Turn LEFT onto Route 108. Go for ~16.1 miles (you are ~35-40 minutes from the camp at this point)

Turn **RIGHT** onto N. Main St. towards Rt. 2, Dixfield, and go 3/10ths of a mile across the bridge. Turn **RIGHT** unto Rt. 2 towards Dixfield. Go for 4/10th of a mile to first light. Turn **LEFT** (ME-142) heading towards Dixfield, Carthage, Weld.

Continue on ME-142 for ~13.7 miles to Weld and the gas station/minimart (Bradbury Mart) on your left in Carthage. Turn **LEFT** unto West Side Road, towards Mt. Blue State Park (which is a couple of miles down this road on the right). Continue on to Camp Lawroweld (another 2-3 miles), camp driveway on the right hand side. The camp sign is small so be on the lookout. There is a road marked “Camp Lawroweld Deliveries”, continue past that road and camp is next driveway on right.



Be aware that once you get within 15-20 miles of Lawroweld there is little cell service available. Please plan accordingly and have the address already loaded into your GPS.

If you drive around the lake, you will eventually pass Camp Lawroweld on the lakeside.
