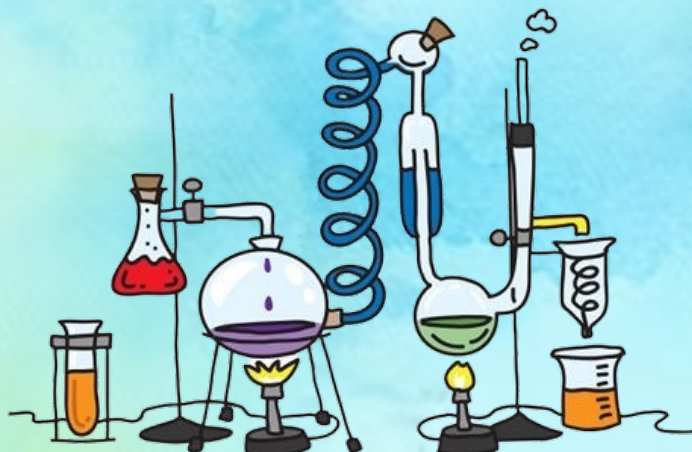
Looking Ahead:

This hands-on week is full of food science, materials science, chemical reactions, STEAM, and MORE!



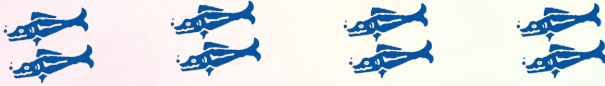
Staff Spotlight:

Valuable or collectible items should not be brought to camp.

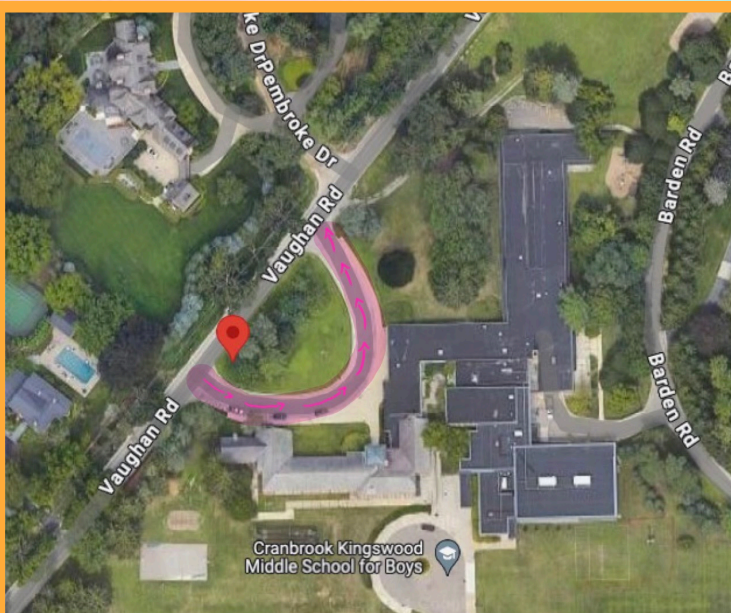


Anyone picking up your camper must have a pick-up authorization sign.
